#### ICYE's Historic Nairobi Meeting:

A Bold Step Toward Decolonizing Volunteerism and Shaping an Inclusive, Global Future

ast August 26-30, 2024, the Youth Engagement Committee (YEC) of the International Cultural Youth Exchange (ICYE) convened in Nairobi, Kenya, for a groundbreaking and historic face-to-face meeting. This was the first time youth representatives from ICYE's global network gathered in person, marking a significant moment in fostering intercultural dialogue, collaboration, and action. The meeting provided a unique opportunity to reflect on the organization's goals and challenges, particularly regarding decolonizing volunteerism, creating a more inclusive and sustainable volunteering framework, and creating a global action plan that could shape the future of volunteering worldwide.

A significant outcome of the in-person meeting was the development of YEC's action plan. This plan, which will guide the work of the committee in the coming years, is not just a list of objectives; it is a roadmap for future action. It outlines the key goals the YEC hopes to achieve, including improving youth engagement, increasing diversity in volunteering, addressing global inequality in the sector, and decolonizing the volunteering narrative. The action plan emphasizes collaboration across national committees and commits to ongoing efforts in making volunteering more inclusive and equitable. This initiative was particularly important for ensuring that the ICYE Federation remains a progressive and dynamic force in global volunteering.

One of the highlights of the meeting was the networking event, which brought together a variety of NGOs and organizations based in Kenya. This was an opportunity for the YEC members to meet local leaders and learn firsthand about the community-driven efforts in Nairobi. The Kenyan leaders also refined the YEC's Action Plan. Attendees actively contributed through discussions and feedback, ensuring inclusivity. Suggestions were incorporated, and YEC engaged with specific working groups on the action plan goals.

The key takeaway from the networking event was the value of international cooperation. It was clear that while the challenges may be global, the solutions are often local. The exchange of knowledge between the global YEC network and local Kenyan organizations demonstrated the power of collaboration across borders. It also highlighted the mutual benefits of volunteering—not just for the volunteers, but also for the communities they serve.

# ICYE'S HISTORIC NAIROBI MEETING:

In almost a week of meetings, YEC evaluated that assessing the current state of volunteering within the ICYE network is needed for an inclusive approach. The discussions on gender inequality in volunteering were particularly eye-opening, with volunteers identifying how gendered expectations and biases affect the types of volunteering roles and experiences available. This, combined with reflections on colonialism's lingering effects, pushed the YEC to rethink how the narrative of volunteering should be presented and experienced.

The meeting in Nairobi was a powerful and transformative experience for the YEC. It was not just an opportunity for dialogue, but a chance to build stronger connections, share best practices, and develop an action plan that will drive positive change in the global volunteering landscape. By combining reflection, discussion, and collaboration, the YEC took a major step toward shaping a more inclusive, sustainable, and equitable future for volunteerism worldwide. YEC was able to lay the foundation for a forward-thinking and inclusive action plan, ready to inspire positive change within the ICYE Federation and beyond.

# Confronting Colonial Shadows for Global Solidarity

Have you ever wondered what it meant when volunteering programs (which foster global solidarity) reflect underlying colonial hierarchies? How about the unintentional creation of absurd generalizations and stereotypes?

Last Nov. 21, 2024, in celebration of ICYE's 75th anniversary, members from the Youth Engagement Committee (YEC) of the ICYE Federation attended an online dialogue on Volunteering and Intercultural Understanding: Decolonized Approach to Global Engagement. As a participant and co-facilitator for the first schedule of the online dialogue, I had the opportunity to interact with diverse individuals during the break-out sessions. Assigned in break-out room 2, I co-facilitated dialogues focused on decolonizing volunteer perspectives... what an interesting AND and uncomfortable experience it was!! I got to learn from other people's encounters and colonial structures thoughts on volunteerism, as well as shared my thoughts and experiences, too. In the end, it was surprising to know that despite our differences in age, gender, nationality, and position, we all have our fair share of experiences on the effects of colonialism.

As I reflect on the event, I realize how colonial legacies have historically defined international volunteering and that dismantling and redefining international

volunteering allows everyone to grasp a future where IVS embodies and reflects genuine global solidarity. This is the part where we, the Youth Engagement Committee (YEC) of ICYE, hope to come into the picture.

Composed of young people from diverse regions around the world, YEC is a wonderful avenue and starting point for young people to challenge traditional inclusive narratives, advocate for practices, and shift the IVS paradigm of dominance and supremacy to that of partnership and solidarity. We firmly believe that young people are crucial in ensuring that IVS remains relevant and responsive to the needs of communities, and we see it as our goal to create an enabling environment for young people to develop their skills, take on leadership roles, and actively participate in decisionmaking processes that shape the future of international volunteering - such as taking part in this decolonizing advocacy.

Indeed, reimagining IVS requires people (especially the youth) to confront uncomfortable truths about our colonial past; however, it is but a necessary step towards genuine solidarity and a more equitable and inclusive future.



#### The YEC Action Plan

Our YEC action plan is the highlight and result of the first meeting in person in Nairobi - Kenya in, in August 2024. It is a proof of our determination and firm commitment to ensure active participation, representation, and engagement of youth in structures, processes, and decision making.

Our main goal is to influence and inspire more young people to take action, by participating in multiple ways and at different levels in volunteering, decision-making, and taking responsibility for shaping our future, contributing to a more peaceful and sustainable world.

The action plan provides the YEC a guideline, a roadmap for the next year(s) and consists of the very different perspectives coming together in the YEC. But more than this, it is proof of our determination and firm commitment to sustainable, inclusive and diverse volunteering.

In general, it includes three main objectives:

Engaging more young people before, during and after their volunteering: As former and current volunteers, we are concerned about the tendency that less young adults decide to volunteer with high-quality programmes abroad, and see the challenge of keeping them engaged in the ICYE federation afterwards. In order to achieve this, we believe

it is important to include young adults' voices when the application formats, expectations and preparation as well as possible homecoming-camps are involved.

What we intend as a long term goal is creating a global ICYE alumni network as a means for promoting global citizenship and integrating volunteers in local structures.

Ensure the active participation and engagement of youth at different levels of the ICYE Federation: To us it is crucial to not only develop additional projects, but to be part of the structures of the federation. We believe in the power of mutual learning processes between more experienced members in the Federation and younger volunteers who are still very connected to their experience. Therefore, our aim is to actively participate in sub-committees of the Federation, to have a voice there and to participate in decision-making.

We are convinced that, uniting different perspectives, the vision of ICYE will be carried forward in a powerful way.

Decolonise the narrative and language on volunteering in the ICYE Federation: YEC members are participating in the Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) subcommittee. We are trying to always be

#### **Definition & Goals**

**Definition:** An active participation, representation, and engagement of youth in structures, processes and decision making.

#### Importance:

- To give new ideas and perspectives on matters of youth for the development of the Federation.
- To contribute to mutual learning between youth and communities.

#### Overarching goals:

To influence and inspire more young people to take action, by participating in multiple ways and at different levels in volunteering, decision-making, and taking responsibility for shaping our future, contributing to a more peaceful and sustainable world.

#### Goal 1: Engage young people before, during, and after their volunteering abroad

- Make international standard format to identify qualified volunteering candidates, including mandatory interviews
- Ensure that high quality host projects are in place
- Inform volunteers on what to expect about host projects and family
- Encourage volunteers to have reasonable expectations and to communicate them.
- Organize a homecoming camp.
- Create an alumni network.





#### Goal 2: Ensure the active participation and engagement of youth at different levels of the ICYE Federation.

- Have an influence on the current work of the Federation Sub-Committees
- International Office: Projects, Communication, Fundraising
- Have an influence on the decision making in the Federation General Assembly
